On his oath states as follows:—I am a duly qualified Medical Practitioner and reside at Ash Street, Batlow.

At about 10.30.a.m.onthe 18th.February, 1948, I was called to see the body of a woman in Town water Channel at keek the upper end of Ash Street, Batlow. The body was that of an elderly woman, whom I recognised to be Mrs. Florence Lilico Keenan. I examined the bbdy and found life to be extinct, death having occurred at least 12 hours previously. There was one small skin injury in the region of the left temple, which from its appearance I considered probably occurred after death. There was no evidence, in my opinion to suggest that the death was caused other than by drowning.

To Sergeant Smith. The fact that the body waas floating, would not suggest that death had occurred before the body was in the water.
